Evidence for journal substitutions

You are planning to make a number of changes to your core Wiley subscriptions. You need to identify potential titles for substitution and you want to use usage data as supporting evidence.

- 1. From the Portal home page, view the YOUR DATA tab. Which COUNTER reports are JUSP gathering from Wiley?
- 2. Your library has also purchased some backfiles from Wiley, but for this project you are only interested in current or frontfile usage. Which JUSP report would you run?

Select this report from the menu and Wiley as the publisher. Run the report for all of 2016.

- 3. What are the advantage of viewing this report over the JR1 alone?
- 4. Sort the report by the appropriate column to complete the table below:
