#### More journal data

Earlier this month we received the details we need from SAGE for all JUSP institutions. We have now updated SAGE data for 135 institutions for December 2016 and Jan and Feb 2017. Thanks especially to those members who contacted SAGE to help us get this progressed.

Cambridge University Press have finally released JR1a reports dating to the launch of Cambridge Core in September 2016, and these have also now been brought up to date.

JR5 reports for Karger are also available from 2015 onwards, and we continue to work on adding more JR2 and JR5 where available.
