The Jisc Usage Statistics Portal (JUSP) is a Jiscfunded service that provides a "one-stop shop" for libraries to view, download and analyse their journal and book usage reports from multiple publishers.

## Note about running JR5 reports in JUSP

Please be aware that the JR5 reports are huge and can be slow to run, especially for publishers such as Wiley, Springer and Elsevier where the reports can contain many thousands of titles and year combinations.


## Wiley book data now available

Both BR2 and BR3 reports have been collected from Wiley, for January 2014 to July 2016 inclusive, and are now available in the Book Portal.

## What is the JR2?

The JR2 is a COUNTER report that shows the number of access denials for each month and journal, as well as the reason for the denial. The most common reason with journals is due to the contact not being licenced i.e. not have entitlement to access that content, and this is shown as "no\_licence".

The reports can be useful in identifying titles and providing evidence for backfile purchases, substitutions, and new subscriptions. The reports provide an additional way to evaluate the potential value of content.
