The Journal Usage Statistics Portal (JUSP) provides a "one-stop shop" for libraries to view, download and analyse their usage reports from NESLi2 publishers http://www.jisc-collections.ac.uk/nesli2/. It responds to current financial challenges with time and cost saving benefits.

JUSP enhancements

Work continues on the JUSP enhancements. Following a review of wishlist items suggested by pilot libraries, new features introduced this month to the titles v NESLi2 deals reports include:

- Separation of usage of titles in backfile collections
- Marking up of fully open access titles using information from the DOAJ
- Adding information on deal and non-deal titles to the usage ranges report, to provide a more realistic figure on non-use

We're working now on support materials that will bring together all these features in the titles v NESLi2 deals reports.

Support materials

Over the next few months we will be developing a range of training and support materials to help you to use JUSP more effectively.

We plan to create content to support the JUSP enhancements project and we've identified further materials that we think will be useful to you. Please get in touch if you have specific requests and we'll try to accommodate these.

Publishers and SUSHI

During February we started to gather data via SUSHI for three new publishers. Libraries can now view BioOne, IOS Press and Future Medicine data from 2009 to the present.

Discussions with further publishers about joining JUSP are ongoing and we hope to bring you more news next month.

Libraries

We would like to welcome the two new institutions that joined JUSP in February 2012. Bishop Grosseteste
University College Lincoln and Newman University
College are the latest libraries to join. This brings the total number of libraries in JUSP to 141.
