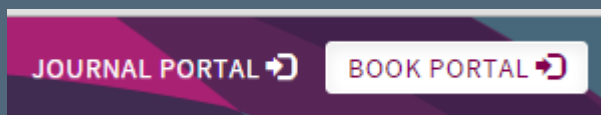

JUSP for ebooks now live

We are pleased to announce that JUSP now contains ebook usage data in addition to journal usage statistics. A pilot group of JUSP-participating libraries have helped to shape this first iteration of the new service. Additional requirements that emerge through use of the service will continue to inform development from this point on.

To access ebook data in JUSP log in to JUSP <http://jusp.mimas.ac.uk> and select BOOK PORTAL from the banner at the top right.



If you have previously registered to use the service you will gain immediate access. Otherwise, you will be redirected to the Books Service registration form. Please fill in your details and submit the form. As soon as we have processed your registration we will send you an email.

There is significant interest from JUSP libraries in being able to access usage data from ebook aggregator services.

Unfortunately, the majority of these aggregator services, including Dawsonera, EBL, Ebrary and MyiLibrary do not currently support the SUSHI protocol.
