The Journal Usage Statistics Portal (JUSP) provides a “one-stop shop” for libraries to view, download and analyse their usage reports from NESLi2 publishers <http://www.jisc-collections.ac.uk/negli2/>. It responds to current financial challenges with time and cost saving benefits.

Enhancements

JUSP contains a new usage report. This has been developed following feedback from libraries participating in the JUSP enhancements project. The usage report provides a comparison of titles within a deal across multiple years. This enables you to see which titles have been added to a deal or removed across a range of years.
