

Publisher priority survey 2013

Thank you to those of you who completed the Publisher Priority Survey to help us identify the publishers that you would most like to see added to JUSP. We have just finished analysing the results.

We had 41 replies and altogether you suggested the names of 87 different publishers in giving us your 10 publisher priorities. 22 of these publishers received votes from four or more of you, and foremost among these were EBSCO with a total of 18 votes (13 as first priority) and Proquest with 17. Other publishers suggested by 10 or more of you were Wolters Kluwer, ACM, Informa Healthcare, American Physical Society and IEEE.

As you'll know we'll already negotiating with these, as with many others on the list, to persuade them to join JUSP. The evidence you have given us should help in these negotiations, as will the contact details you have provided for particular publishers. For any new suggestions, we are checking what platforms they are available on and whether their usage data is COUNTER-compliant.



The survey results will be made available on the JUSP website.

Core titles

A number of institutions have now entered their core/subscribed titles in JUSP. Details of how to do so can be found in our support guide
