## More reports and suppliers added

This month we have added further datasets for four publishers to JUSP.

- American Psychological Association (APA) – BR2, DB1 & PR1
- De Gruyter – BR2 & BR3
- JSTOR - JR2 and JR5
- MIT Press - JR1 GOA
- SPIE - International Society for Optics and Photonics – BR2 & BR3

In addition, by working with Emerald we have also gathered usage data for a further 27 institutions that have books or journals with the publisher.

## Friendly Guide to Release 5 for Librarians

Release 5 of the COUNTER Code of Practice will come into effect from January 2019 and providers will be required to start supplying these reports in order to be COUNTER-compliant. In March, the Friendly Guide to Release 5 for Librarians was published to help librarians prepare for the transition to R5. The guide includes information about the new Metrics, Master Reports and Standard Views. It also provides a section which maps the key Release 4 reports to their Release 5 counterparts as well as providing several user scenarios.
