



The Journal Usage Statistics Portal (JUSP)

The Journal Usage Statistics Portal (JUSP) is a JISC-funded service that provides a “one-stop shop” for libraries to view, download and analyse their journal usage reports from multiple publishers. It responds to current financial challenges with time and cost saving benefits.

Publishers and SUSHI

We are delighted to welcome the latest publishers to join JUSP in October 2012. These include Duke University Press, the American Diabetes Association (ADA) and the Geological Society of America (GSA).

In addition to the above, we implemented SUSHI for the Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drugs, JSTOR and the new ASCE platform this month.

Prior to October, JUSP held Taylor & Francis data from June 2011 onwards. This was due to a platform change around this time. We are pleased to report that following a successful collaboration with Taylor & Francis we have been able to load data into the portal back to January 2010.

JSTOR

A major success story for JUSP this month has been the addition of usage data from JSTOR. The service collected JR1 and JR1a reports from January 2010 to September 2012 for 113 JUSP libraries. Within two weeks of the request for information on the actual collections that libraries took, there were replies from over 90 sites.

Title lists for 2012 have now been added for around 25 collections and all those libraries that have supplied deal information can match their JR1 reports with the appropriate collection titles in the ‘View usage of titles and deals’ reports.

Webinars
