We are delighted to welcome the latest publishers to join JUSP in September 2012. These include the Royal College of Psychiatrists, Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drugs and Society for General Microbiology.

We have recently implemented SUSHI for the Royal College of Psychiatrists and expect to do the same for the Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drugs and JSTOR imminently. Other publishers in the pipeline are American Chemical Society (ACS) and Irish Newspaper Archives.

JUSP Community Advisory Group

As part of the continuing work to ensure that the JUSP service is developed to meet the needs of its user community, JUSP is establishing a JUSP Community Advisory Group. It is intended that this new group will provide input to the ongoing development of JUSP at a strategic and operational level. Work will involve providing recommendations on various aspects of service development; and reviewing and commenting on service enhancements and priorities. It will complement the excellent feedback we already get from our active user community and is not in any way intended to replace it.

We are looking for approximately 8 representatives from the JUSP user community to be a part of the Group and represent the broad range of institutions in JUSP. It is expected that the business of the Community Advisory Group will primarily be conducted virtually to provide flexibility and reduce time commitment, though occasional face-to-face meetings may be held. The initial term of membership will be for up to 2 years.

We are looking for some active community members to contribute - membership of the JUSP Community Advisory Group will provide an excellent opportunity to be more actively involved in the development of JUSP.

The team will be looking to make the Group as fully representative of the user community as possible and this will be a key factor in deciding its composition.
