The Journal Usage Statistics Portal (JUSP) is a Jisc-funded service that provides a “one-stop shop” for libraries to view, download and analyse their journal usage reports from multiple publishers. It responds to current financial challenges with time and cost saving benefits.

2014/15 SCONUL return

Many of you may currently be pulling together statistics for your annual SCONUL return, and we're pleased JUSP is able to help you gather statistics on usage of your electronic journals. For the 2014/15 return, we have now collected data for all JUSP publishers for August 2014 to July 2015 except for UKSG Insights and IOS Press (we have these to April 2015 only due to them changing platform and not yet providing details of their SUSHI platform). We would recommend you contact them directly for May-July data.

Some other publishers are signed up to JUSP but not currently supplying data to us - these are detailed in the “Publisher Issues” tab on your JUSP welcome screen.

OUP data restated for July 2015

OUP data for July 2015 have all been replaced on JUSP. According to the publisher there was an issue with double counting and most people's data will have been inflated. The corrected reports for 154 institutions have all been downloaded, processed and loaded into JUSP.

Core titles

Core title updates now take place on KB+ and any changes are reflected in JUSP - this should reduce duplication of effort and ensure your records are kept up-to-date. KB+ have produced guides to help you if you're not a regular KB+ user.
