## Publisher update (part 2)

Following last month’s summary of progress with the 22 priority publishers identified in the last survey, here is more detailed information on the individual publishers.

In addition to the nine priority publishers who have joined JUSP since the survey (listed last month), further publishers from the priority list are in discussions with JUSP about the possibility of joining. These include Proquest, Wolters Kluwer/Ovid, Gale Cengage, Palgrave Macmillan, Lippincott Williams and Wilkins, Mary Ann Liebert and American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME)). Publishers often indicate consumer demand as a reason for participation and lack of demand as a reason for non-participation. We would encourage you to contact your publisher representative if you subscribe to titles from any of these publishers particularly and you would like to see that usage reflected in JUSP.

And finally a quick reminder that the team has created a rolling publisher ‘wish list’ for JUSP institutions to suggest potential publishers at any time throughout the year. 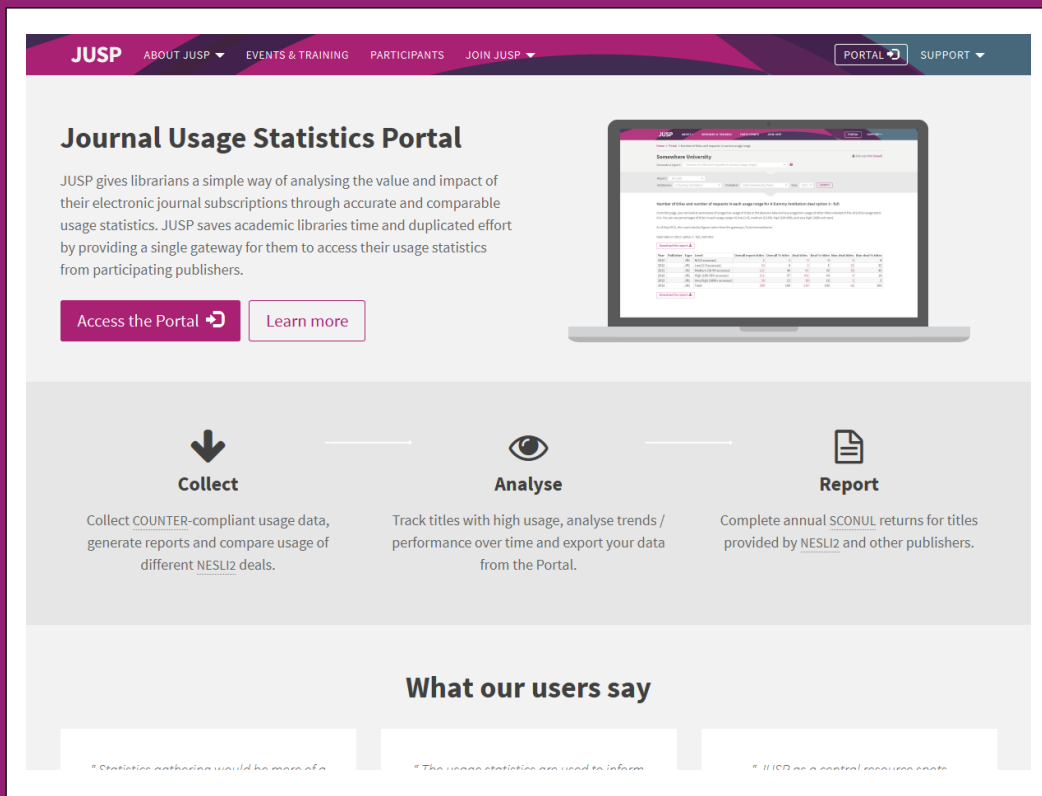
