## Highlights of 2013

2013 was a busy and productive year for JUSP. During the year we:

1. Added over 70 million individual usage statistics to our database
2. Welcomed 17 additional publishers who now have data available in JUSP
3. Welcomed ten new libraries
4. Ran a ‘Making the most of JUSP’ event in Cardiff and two webinars (‘Using JUSP with your own data’; ‘Using JUSP for your SCOUNL return’)
5. Spoke at various conferences and events
6. Met with our Community Advisory Group (CAG) on two occasions
7. Developed production and test servers and a SUSHI client for COUNTER Release 4. We are starting to gather Release 4 data including the new Gold Open Access (JR1 GOA) report as publishers move over to Release 4.
8. Conducted a publisher priority survey and a community survey
9. Participated in the RAPTOR-JUse project
10. Worked with the KB+ team to enable interoperability between the two services
11. Undertook an ebook pilot trial
12. Undertook a usage profiling pilot and subsequently set up usage profiling for a number of publishers
13. Gathered data to inform a refresh of the JUSP website which will take place early in the New Year

## Looking ahead to 2014

We have further developments planned for 2014 and will be using the results from the latest community survey to plan and prioritise our work.
