UKSG Transfer Code of Practice to be maintained by NISO

The Transfer Code of Practice provides voluntary guidelines for publishers to follow when transferring journal titles to ensure that the journal content remains easily accessible. It has been announced that responsibility for supporting and maintaining the Code of Practice will be taken over by the National Information Standards Organization (NISO).

The Enhanced Transfer Alerting Service (ETAS), set up to enable publishers to easily communicate journal transfers, will continue to be available at <http://etas.jusp.mimas.ac.uk/>.
