The Journal Usage Statistics Portal (JUSP) provides a “one-stop shop” for libraries to view, download and analyse their usage reports from NESLi2 publishers <http://www.jisc-collections.ac.uk/nesli2/>. It responds to current financial challenges with time and cost saving benefits.

### JUSP Publishers

### SCONUL Return

A change to the SCONUL Return report provides a new option to select all years as well as individual academic years. Selecting all years produces multiple pie charts and tables on a single screen. This is a useful indicator for showing trends over time.

### JUSP Libraries

### SUSHI

Usage statistics are now being gathered via the Standardized Usage Statistics Harvesting Initiative (SUSHI) protocol for seven publishers and intermediaries. We have recently started collecting data via SUSHI for American Institute of Physics (AIP) and Nature Publishing Group. Others include Oxford University Press, Springer, Project MUSE/The John Hopkins University Press, EBSCO EJS and Publishing Technology (ingentaconnect). We plan to gather Swets data via SUSHI within the next few weeks. We are currently in discussions with four more publishers to implement SUSHI and will add more over the coming months.
