Publishers and SUSHI

During March we started to gather data via SUSHI for one new publisher. Libraries can now view Brill data from 2009 to the present.

Cambridge University Press (CUP) has now joined JUSP and we've been working with their technical team to arrange SUSHI set-up. We aim to provide access to data through the portal in April.

We are also working with the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) to implement SUSHI and will have further news shortly.

Discussions with further publishers about joining JUSP are ongoing and we hope to bring you more news next month.
